#### Test Content and Structure

The GRE Subject Tests will be administered in a computer-delivered format. Total testing time for the GRE Mathematics Test will be two hours and 50 minutes. Total testing time for the GRE Physics Test and GRE Psychology Test will be two hours.

#### Test Dates and Locations

Beginning in September 2023, the GRE Subject Tests will be administered on computer worldwide on multiple dates in September, October and April. At home testing will also be offered in most locations.

The books are intended to familiarize you with the question types and timing so you can do your best on the actual test.
